How to prepare your presentation:

1. Choose a topic and collect ideas in your student's book or on the internet.
2. Take notes on cue cards and number them.

3. Use visual material to underline your talk (poster, PowerPoint presentation, maps, charts, cartoons etc.)
 - **Use** the visual material during your talk !!!!
 - **Charts and tables** are good to present numbers
 - **Timelines** are good to show developments
 - **Photos and cartoons** are good to motivate the audience
4. Practice your talk in front of the mirror or for your parents (at least 3 times!!!)

How to structure your talk:

Introduce the topic	<i>My presentation is about...</i>
Present the structure of your talk	<i>My presentation has got ...parts. It is divided into...parts. First, I'd like to talk about... Second,... Then... Finally...</i>
Start with the first part	<i>First, I want to talk about... First, I'd like to talk about...</i>
Tell the audience when you continue with the next part.	<i>Let's move to the next point which is... Now I'm going to talk about...</i>
Refer to pictures or charts on your visual material	<i>This picture/chart shows...</i>
Finish your presentation	<i>That's the end of my presentation. Thank you for listening. Have you got any questions?</i>
